Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Bishop Hall Jubilee School Alumni Limited ("the Association") set out on pages 5 to 13, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 March 2024, and the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

1. General information

Bishop Hall Jubilee School Alumni Limited (the "Association") is an association incorporated in Hong Kong under the Hong Kong Companies Ordiance on 6 March 2000. It is a non-profit making organization and its members' liabilities are limited by guarantee to the extent of HK\$10.00 each in case of liquidation.

The address of its registered office is 2C Oxford Road, Kowloon, Hong Kong. The principal activities of the Association are to promote and maintain close bondage between the former and existing students, teachers, and other staff of Bishop Hall Jubilee School.

2. <u>Statement of compliance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards</u>

The Association's financial statements have been prepared in accordance with all applicable Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards (HKFRSs), which includes all applicable individual Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards, Hong Kong Accounting Standards (HKASs) and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (HKICPA), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong, and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. A summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Association is set out in note 3.

3. <u>Summary of significant accounting policies</u>

(a) Basis of preparation of the financial statements

The measurement basis used in preparing the financial statements is historical cost.

(b) Recognition of revenues

After the adoption of HKFRS 15 *Revenue from contracts with customers*, the Association recognises revenue from contracts with customers when the Association satisfies a performance obligation by transferring a promised good or service (i.e. an asset) to a customer. An asset is transferred when the customer obtains control of that asset. When a performance obligation is satisfied, the Association recognises as revenue the amount of the transaction price (which excludes estimates of variable consideration that are constrained in accordance with HKFRS 15) that is allocated to that performance obligation. Further details of the Association's revenue and other income recognition policies are as follows:

Donations

Revenue from donations are recognised upon receipt when the amount of revenue can be determined with certainty. Revenue arising from organised functions are recognised upon the conclusion of the function.

<u>Bank Interest income</u>

Interest income is recognised as other income as it accrues using the effective interest method.

3. <u>Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)</u>

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and at bank and demand deposits with bank. Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purpose of statement of cash flows, bank overdrafts which are repayable on demand form an integral part of the Association's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents.

(d) Trade and other payable

Trade and other payables are initially measured at fair value and, after initial recognition, at amortised cost, except for payables with no stated interest rate and the effect of discounting being immaterial, that are measured at their original invoice amount.

4. <u>Revenue and turnover</u>

Revene and turnover represents donation income received, if any, during the year.
