### EXPLORATION TRIP TO GUILIN, GUANGXI



The captivating exploration trip to Guilin, Guangxi, from March 22nd to 24th, was organized by the Geography, Chinese History, Visual Arts, and Civic Education teams. Touring the Seven Star Scenic Area, students appreciated the history of cultural preservation and various industries, while immersing themselves in the breathtaking mountain and water scenery of Guilin. The next day, they admired the collection of extraterrestrial meteorites, artifacts, fossils and crystals at the Earth Memorial Museum before exploring the enchanting natural wonder of the Silver Cave Karst Cavern and enjoying cultural performances in the idyllic setting.

The highlight of the trip was the boat tour to the iconic Elephant Trunk Hill, which deepened the students' understanding of its importance in the local tourism culture. This invaluable learning experience was made possible by the dedicated teachers who organized the trip, as well as the enthusiastic tour guides and local staff who welcomed the students.



### GUANGZHOU SISTER SCHOOL CULTURAL EXCHANGE TOUR



47 teachers and students from our school visited Guangzhou from May 6th to 8th, to exchange with two sister schools.

First, we visited Lingshan Middle School(廣州南沙靈山中學). We toured the campus and participated in the flag raising ceremony. The students also experienced various exchange activities such as rice ball making activity and talent show.

Our school also visited the Guangzhou No.5 Middle School(廣州市第五中學). We watched their morning exercises and had interactive teaching sessions. The teachers from both schools exchanged ideas on curriculum and school management.

This exchange strengthened the friendship between the three schools. The teachers and students learned about each other's school life and education systems. We also visited historical and cultural sites in Guangzhou to experience and learn about the city.



### JAPAN ENVIRONMENTAL AND CULTURAL TOUR



From June 28th to July 4th, 39 students from our school, accompanied by 5 teachers, embarked on a life-changing Fukui Environmental and Cultural Study Tour in Japan. Students immersed themselves in the Japanese shrine culture at the Ōtaki Shrine, marveled at the natural beauty of Echizen-en and Mikata Five Lakes, and engaged in cross-cultural exchanges with peers from Fukui's Jichi University and Kōchi High School.

The trip offered hands-on experiences, including crafting traditional items and participating in environmental stewardship activities. Recreational pursuits, such as canoeing and summer fireworks, further enriched their understanding of Fukui's vibrant local culture.

### F.4 GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

On May 13th to 14th, Form 4 Geography students conducted a two-day outdoor field study. In Central, they studied microclimate and heat island effect, collecting data in groups. At Cheung Chau's Tung Wan and Kwun Yam Wan, they observed wave height, measured beach gradient and examined sand particles.

The hands-on experience allowed students to apply textbook knowledge, prepare for exams, and gain precious insights. Thankfully, the sunny weather enabled the successful completion of the two-day expedition. The students are grateful for this valuable learning opportunity organized by the school.

### F.5 GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

From November 30th to December 1st, our Form 5 Geography students went on a 2-day, 1-night field trip to Cheung Chau. During these 2 days, our students attended classes at the Caritas Chan Chun Ha Field Studies Centre (St. Francis Campus), and stayed in the dormitories of the Caritas - Hong Kong - Jockey Club Ming Fai Camp.

Throughout this field trip, our students gained first-hand experience in conducting fieldwork on different types of rocks, which allowed them to apply their textbook knowledge to real-world cases and further develop their geographical skills. Although the weather was not the most cooperative, the field trip was still successfully completed, and the students greatly valued this learning experience.


### FORM 3 LEADERSHIP TRAINING CAMP

### **BBQ EVENT**


The 2024 alumni association BBQ event was held on April 13th, and it was enthusiastically supported by all alumni.


### PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION "BARBECUE REUNION" EVENT



本校與協恩中學攜手合辦第二屆「思行盃」聯校小學華語辯論賽。今年共有九龍塘宣道小學、九龍塘學校(小學部)、聖方濟各英文小學及協恩中學附屬小學四所學校參與。

經過兩輪激烈的預賽,九龍塘宣道小學及協恩中學附屬小學脫穎而出,晉身決賽。決賽於 5 月 25 日在本校禮堂舉行。評判陣容鼎盛,包括香港大學前普通話辯論隊隊長陳安晴小姐、香港大學普通話辯論隊成員溫嘉怡小姐,以及本校中文辯論隊教練李文彬老師。決賽當日,溫小姐及林倚琦小姐更以講座形式,與決賽選手分享參與辯論賽的寶貴經驗。經過一番激烈交鋒,最終由九龍塘宣道小學脫穎而出,摘得第二屆「思行盃」冠軍。
